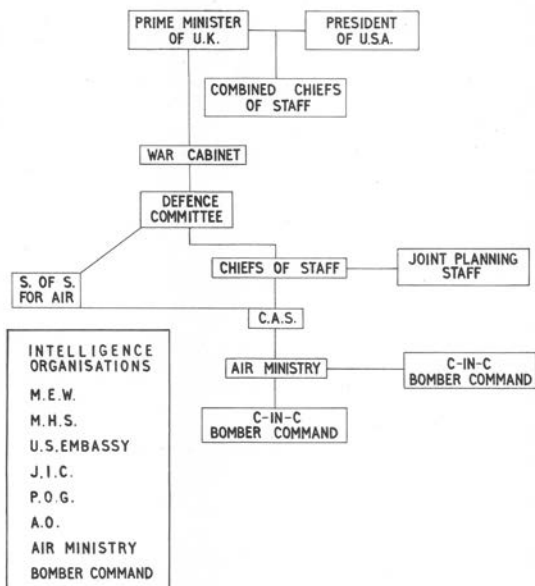


TABLE II

APRIL — SEPTEMBER 1944

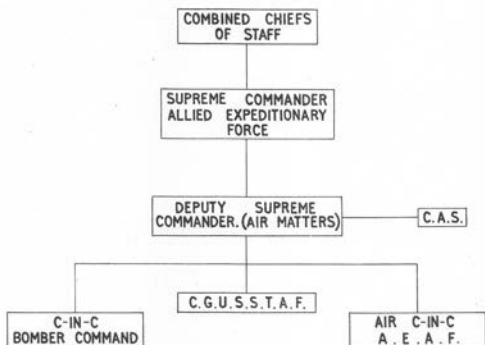
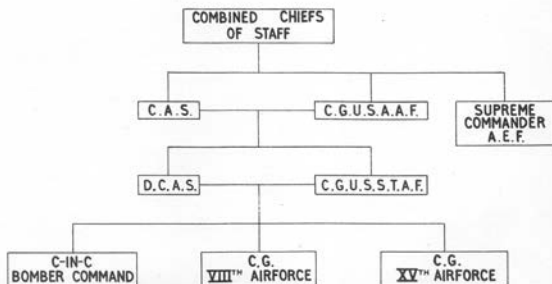

THE OCTAGON CHAIN OF COMMAND

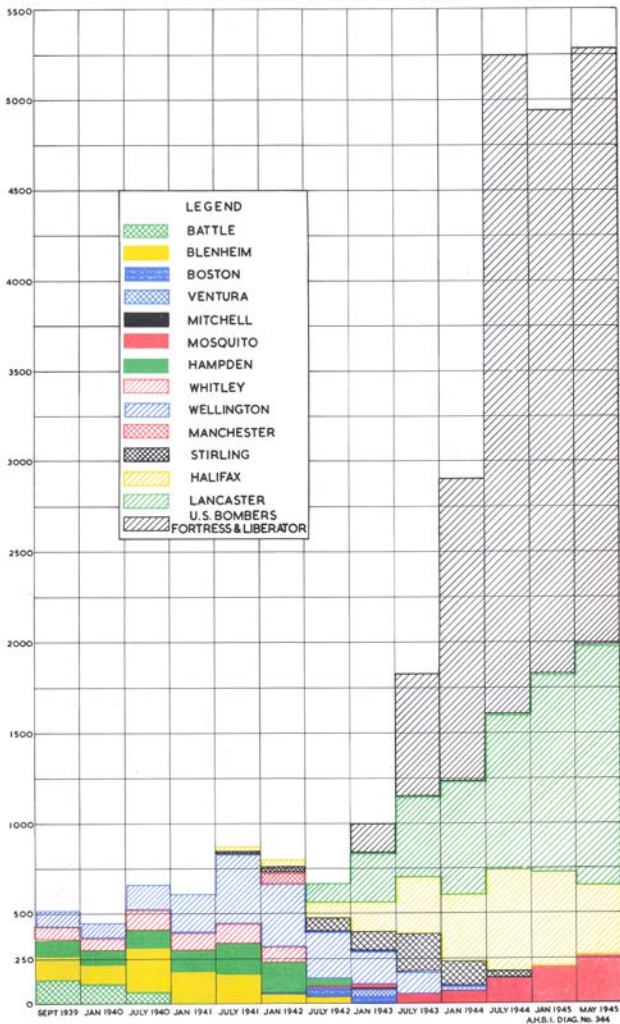

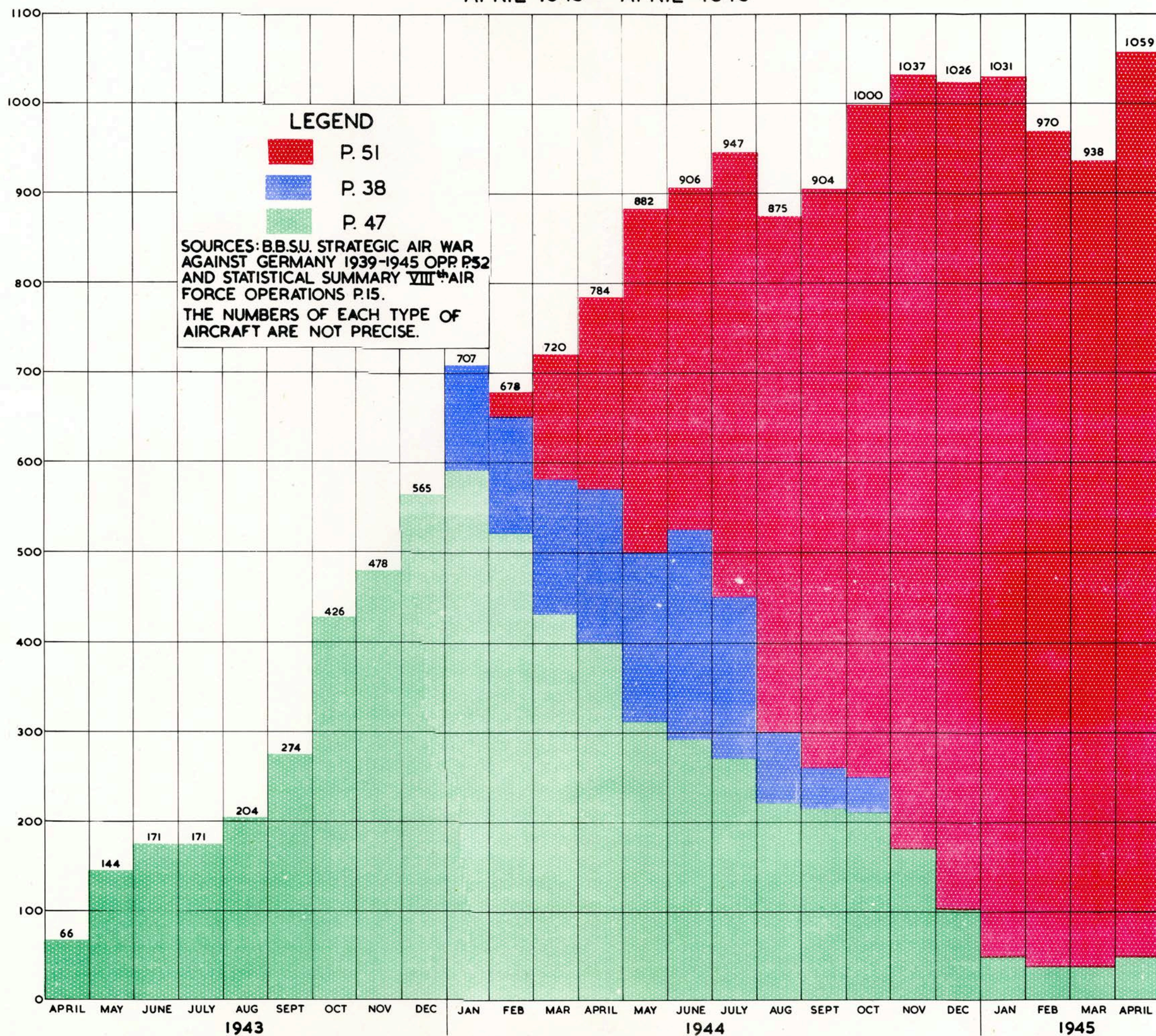

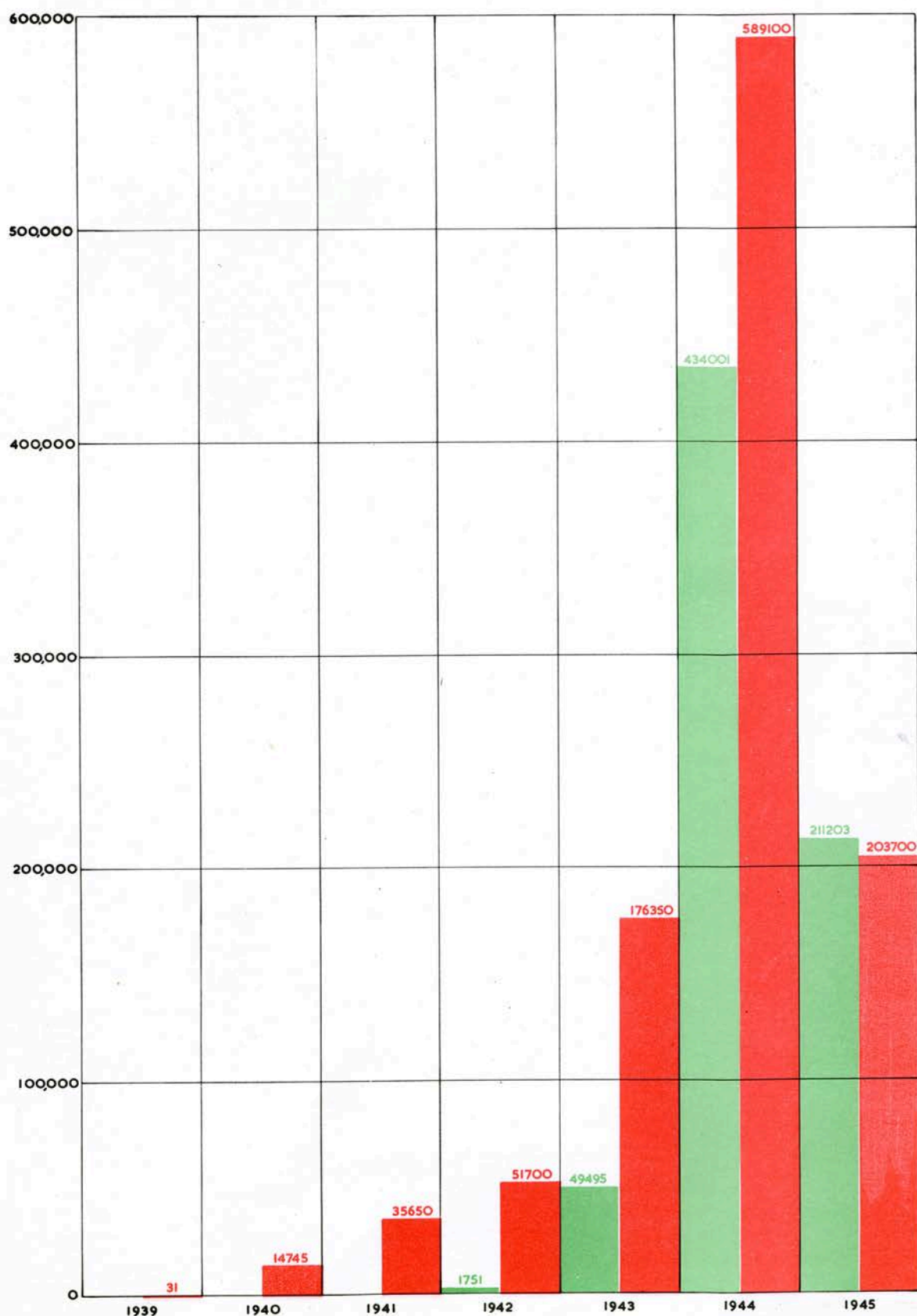

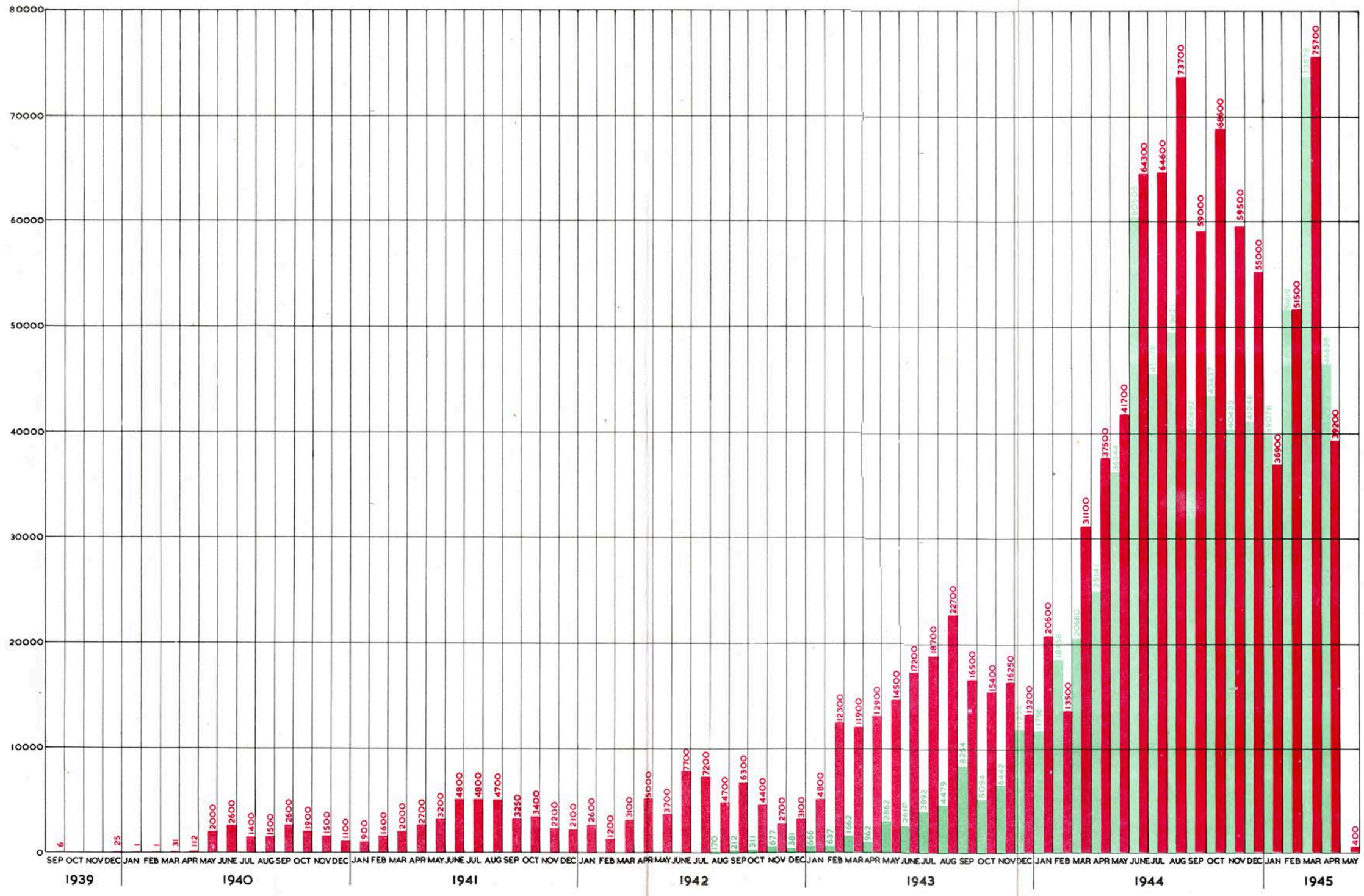
