

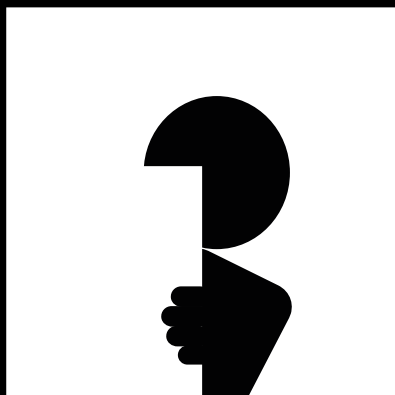
IN THE RARE EVENT OF a firearms or weapons attack

HIDE



HIDE It's better to hide than to confront. Remember to turn your phone to silent and turn off vibrate. Barricade yourself in if you can. Then finally and only when it is safe to do so...

TELL



TELL the police by calling 999.

SAFETY GUIDE

The direction contained within this poster applies the Stay Safe principle in accordance with guidance issued by the UK Government National Counter Terrorism Security Office (NCTSO).

This is a guide on what to do if there is an attack affecting a RAFAC establishment. It is a tried and tested guide created alongside the NPCC 'Stay Safe' campaign and is equally relevant outside the organisation. If at any point you feel that following elements of the advice will put you or others in danger then do NOT follow it.

Apply common sense and remain vigilant

The guide has been designed to provide measures to **PROTECT** and **SECURE** personnel and defines the Immediate Actions to be taken by all personnel in the event of an armed attack.

Report any suspicious activity to the Police on 999, or the Anti-Terrorist Hotline 0800 789 32. Ensure your CoC is also kept informed.

When reporting suspicious activity the following cues may help:

A-H (People)

Age
Build
Clothing
Distinguishing marks
Elevation (Height)
Face (Colour/Shape)
Gait (Movement pattern)
Hair (Style/Colour/Length)

SCRIM(Vehicles)

Shape (Saloon/Estate/Van)
Colour
Registration
Identifying marks
Make/Model
